For it was fitting for Him,

(a) for whom are all things, and (b) through whom are all things,

in bringing many sons to glory,

to perfect the author of their salvation through sufferings. For both

- 1. He who sanctifies and
- 2. those who are sanctified

are all from one Father;

for which reason He is not ashamed

to call them brethren, saying,

"I will proclaim Thy name to My brethren, In the midst of the congregation I will sing Thy praise." And again,

"I will put My trust in Him."

And again, "Behold, I and the children whom God has given Me."

Since then the children share in flesh and blood.

He Himself likewise also partook of the same, that through death He might

1. render powerless him who had the power of death, that is, the devil; and might

2. deliver those who through fear of death

were subject to slavery all their lives.

For assuredly He does not give help to angels, but He gives help to the descendant of Abraham.
