To sanctify
and accept us

Association

Not ashamed

For it was fitting for Him,
(a) for whom are all things, and
(b) through whom are all things,
in bringing many sons to glory,
to perfect the author of their salvation through sufferings.

FITTING

For both

1. He who sanctifies and
 2. those who are sanctified
- are all from one *Father*;

Common source

for which reason He is not ashamed
to call them brethren, saying,

"I will proclaim Thy name to My brethren,
In the midst of the congregation I will sing Thy praise."

Psalm 22:22

And again,

"I will put My trust in Him."

Isaiah 8:17-18

And again,

13 "Behold, I and the children whom God has given Me."

He's our brother



Overcame shame

To deliver us
from the Devil
and death

Liberation

Not defeated

Since then the children share in flesh and blood,
He Himself likewise also partook of the same,
that through death He might

SLAVERY

Common substance

1. render powerless him who had the power of death,
that is, the devil; and might
2. deliver those who through fear of death
were subject to slavery all their lives.

For assuredly He does not give help to angels,
but He gives help to the descendant of Abraham.

He's our champion



1. Defanging the Devil
2. Delivering the derelict

Overcame fear

Focus on the individual.

To become
our merciful
high priest

Representation

Not indifferent

Therefore,
He had to be made like His brethren in all things,
that He might become
a (1) merciful and (2) faithful high priest
in things pertaining to God,
to make propitiation for the sins of the people.

PROPITIATION

For since He Himself

was tempted in that which He has suffered,
He is able to come to the aid

Common suffering

18 of those who are tempted.

Overcame guilt

He's our priest
